Notes to the financial statements

1. Company Overview

Chitpavan Foundation ('the Company') was incorporated on 06th October 2009 under the erstwhile section 25 of the Companies Act, 1956 (presently section 8 of the Companies Act, 2013).

The company is primarily engaged in providing educational, medical and other support for promotion and upbringing of persons belonging to all castes and communities.

2. Summary of significant accounting policies

The Company has complied with all the Accounting Standards applicable to section 8 companies.

The accounting policies set out below have been applied consistently to the periods presented in these financial statements.

i. Basis of preparation of financial statements

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared and presented under the historical cost convention, on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India ('Indian GAAP') and comply with the Accounting standards by the Central Government under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 ('the Act') read with the Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2021, as amended and other relevant provisions of the Companies Act, to the extent notified and applicable. The financial statements are presented in Indian rupees.

ii. Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with Indian GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent liabilities as of the date of financial statements, and the reported amount of revenue and expenses during the reporting period. The estimates and assumptions used in the accompanying financial statements are based upon Management's evaluation of the relevant facts and circumstances as of the date of the financial statements. Actual results may differ from those estimates used in preparing the accompanying financial statements. Differences between the actual results and estimates are recognized in the period in which the results are known / materialized.

iii. Current / non-current classification

Schedule III to the Act requires assets and liabilities to be classified as either Current or Non-current.

An asset is classified as 'current' when it satisfies any of the following criteria:

- (a) It is expected to be realized in, or is intended for sale or consumption in, the company's normal operating cycle;
- (b) It is held primarily for the purpose of being traded;
- (c) It is expected to be realized within twelve months after the Balance Sheet date; or
- (d) It is cash or a cash equivalent unless it is restricted from being exchanged or used to settle a liability for at least twelve months after the Balance Sheet date.

All other assets are classified as non-current.

A liability is classified as 'current' when it satisfies any of the following criteria:

- (a) It is expected to be settled in the company's normal operating cycle;
- (b) It is held primarily for the purpose of being traded;
- (c) It is expected to be settled within twelve months after the Balance Sheet date; or
- (d) The company does not have an unconditional right to defer settlement of the liability for at least twelve months after the Balance Sheet date. Terms of liability that could, at the option of the counterparty, result in its settlement by issue of equity instrument do not affect its classification.

All other liabilities are classified as non-current.

All assets and liabilities have been classified as current or non-current as per the Company's normal operating cycle and other criteria set out above which are in accordance with Schedule III to the Act.

iv. Operating Cycle

Based on the nature of products/services of the Company and the normal time between acquisition of assets and their realization in cash or cash equivalents, the Company has determined its operating cycle as 12 months for the purpose of classification of its assets and liabilities as current and non-current.

v. Cash and bank balances

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents consist of cash on hand, demand deposits and short term, highly liquid investments that are readily convertible into cash and which are subject to insignificant risk of changes in value. For this purpose, "short term"

means investments having original maturity of three months or less from the date of investment.

Other bank balances

Demand deposits with banks due to mature within 12 months from the Balance Sheet date.

vi. Cash Flow Statement

Cash flow statement is reported using the indirect method, whereby profit / (loss) before extraordinary items and tax is adjusted for the effects of transactions of noncash nature and any deferrals or accruals of past or future cash receipts or payments. The cash flows from operating, investing and financing activities of the Company are segregated based on the available information.

vii. Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE) and Depreciation/Amortisation/ Impairment

I. Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

- a) Property, plant and equipment (PPE) are carried at cost of acquisition or construction less accumulated depreciation/ amortization and/or accumulated impairment loss, if any. The cost of an item of PPE comprises its purchase price, including import duties and other non-refundable taxes or levies and any directly attributable cost of bringing the asset to its working condition for its intended use, any trade discounts and rebates are deducted in arriving at the purchase price.
- *b)* PPE acquired wholly or partly with grant/subsidy from government are recorded at the net acquisition cost to the Company.
- *c)* A PPE is eliminated from the financial statements on disposal or when no further benefit is expected from the use and disposal.
- d) Losses arising from retirement and gains or losses arising from disposal of the PPE are measured as the difference between the net disposal proceeds and the carrying amount of the asset and are recognized in the Statement of Income and Expenditure.
- e) PPE under construction/development which are not ready for use at the Balance Sheet date are disclosed as capital work-in-progress.

II. Depreciation and Amortisation

a) Depreciation on PPE is provided using the Written Down Value method as per the rates derived by management, which in management's opinion reflect the estimated useful lives of an assets as specified in Schedule II to the Act.

- b) Depreciation is provided on a pro-rata basis i.e. from the date on which the asset is ready for use.
- c) The residual value, useful lives and method of depreciation are reviewed by the management at each financial year-end and revised, if appropriate. In case of a revision, the unamortised depreciable amount is charged over the revised remaining useful life.

III. Impairment of assets

a) PPE are reviewed at each reporting date to determine if there is any indication of impairment. For assets in respect of which any such indication exists at the reporting date, the asset's recoverable amount is estimated.

viii. Revenue recognition

Other Income

Revenue is primarily derived from Donations received and interest income from investments.

- a. Revenue from Donations is recognized as income in the year of receipt.
- b. Revenue is recognized when the right to receive the same is established.
- c. Interest income is recognised on a time proportion basis taking into account the amount outstanding and the interest rate applicable.

ix. Investments

Investments that are readily realisable and intended to be held for not more than a year from the date of acquisition are classified as current investments. All other Investments are classified as long-term investments. In case of long-term investments which is expected to be realised within 12 months after the reporting date is disclosed under 'current assets' as current portion of long-term investments in accordance with the current non-current classification of criteria specified in Schedule III of the Act.

Long-term investments (including the current portion thereof) are carried at cost less any diminution, other-than-temporary diminution in value, determined separately for each individual investment.

Current investments are carried at the lower of cost and fair value. The comparison of cost and fair value is done separately in respect of each category of investment.

The reduction in the carrying amount is reversed when there is a rise in the value of the investment or if the reasons for the reduction no longer exist. Any reductions in the carrying amount and any reversals of such reductions are charged or credited to the Statement of Income and Expenditure.

x. Employee benefits

The company has not employed any employees. Hence no provision for retirement benefit is made.

xi. Earnings per share ('EPS')

Basic EPS is calculated by dividing the net profit or loss for the year attributable to equity shareholders by the weighted average number of equity-shares outstanding during the year.

For the purpose of calculating Diluted EPS, the net profit or loss for the period attributable to equity shareholders and weighted average number of shares outstanding during the period are adjusted for the effects of all dilutive potential equity shares. Potential equity shares are deemed to be dilutive only if their conversion to equity shares would decrease the net profit per share from continuing ordinary operations. Potential dilutive equity shares are deemed to be converted at the beginning of the period, unless they have been issued at a later date. Potential equity shares are anti-dilutive when their conversion to equity shares would increase earnings per share from continuing ordinary activities or decrease loss per share from continuing ordinary activities. The effects of anti-dilutive potential equity shares are ignored in calculating diluted EPS.

xii. Taxation

Income Tax

Income tax expense comprises of current tax (i.e. amount of tax for the period determined in accordance with the income tax law and considering deduction available under Income tax Act ,1961 and other applicable Tax law) and deferred tax charge or credit (reflecting the tax effect of timing difference between the accounting income and taxable income for the period).

Deferred Tax

The deferred tax charge or credit and the corresponding deferred tax liability or asset is recognised using the tax rates that have been enacted or substantively enacted at the Balance Sheet date. Deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent when there is reasonable certainty that the asset can be realised in future. In case of unabsorbed depreciation or carried forward loss under taxation laws, deferred tax assets are recognised only if there is virtual certainty of realisation of such assets. Deferred tax assets are reviewed at each Balance Sheet date and written

down or written up to reflect the amount that is reasonably/virtually certain (as the case may be) to be realised.

Minimum alternate tax (MAT) credit is recognised only to the extent there is a reasonable certainty that the Company will pay normal income tax during the specified period. MAT credit entitlement is reviewed at each balance sheet date and written down to the extent there is no reasonable certainty to the effect that the Company will pay normal income tax during the specified period.

xiii. Net profit or loss for the year, Prior Period Items and changes in accounting policy

The net profit for the year comprises of profit or loss from ordinary activities and extraordinary items which have been disclosed on the face of Statement of Income and Expenditure. Extraordinary items are disclosed in the Statement of Income and Expenditure to reflect the impact on current profit.

A change in accounting policy is made only if the adoption of a different accounting policy is required by statute or for compliance with an accounting standard or if it is considered that the change would result in a more appropriate presentation of the financial statements of the enterprise.

xiv. Provisions and contingent liabilities

Provisions

The Company creates a provision when there is present obligation as a result of a past event that probably requires an outflow of resources, and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation. Provisions are recognised at the best estimate of the expenditure required to settle the present obligation at the Balance Sheet date. The provisions are measured on an undiscounted basis.

Contingent liabilities and contingent assets

A disclosure of contingent liability is made when there is a possible obligation or a present obligation that may, but probably will not, require an outflow of resources. When there is a possible obligation or a present obligation in respect of which the likelihood of outflow of resources is remote, no provision or disclosure is made.

Contingent assets are neither recognised nor disclosed in the financial statements. However, contingent assets are assessed continually and if it is virtually certain that an inflow of economic benefits will arise, the asset and related income are recognised in the period in which the change occurs.
